The Canadian Wake Park Championships will be returning to an old-yet-new full cable venue for 2016; the freshly restored Pointes Wake Park in Point Calumet, QC. Two of Quebec's top riders Yan Tibo and Alex Savoie have taken over the management of the park, and have been working diligently to produce an exciting new fleet of unique features. The event will take place throughout the weekend and will include both amateur and pro categories.

Payments for registration are to made in upon arrival at Pointes Wake Park in Point Calumet, QC. Registration will cost \$50 (CASH ONLY) per category athletes compete in. Riders will need their WSWC competitive membership to compete, which they can get through their provincial association.

COMPETITION RULES AND REGULATIONS:

UNDERSTANDING ROUNDS OF COMPETITION

Qualifying round;

Typical of professional events where there is a large number of participants in the same division. Cuts are made to narrow the field for the following rounds.

Quarter finals;

Usually the first of 3 rounds for most events. There can be cuts made in this round, qualifying riders through to semi finals.

This round is usually the first of 3 rounds in Canadian Nationals for larger divisions, 9+ participants. All riders qualify through to the next round. Results are used for seeding for the Semi final round, where there will be cuts for the finals.

Semi finals;

The previous round to the finals. Made up of results of previous rounds and seeding. Can be the first of 2 rounds of competition for smaller divisions where riders advance to the finals.

This is primarily the first round of competition for 75% of participants for Canadian Nationals, where all riders advance to the finals.

Typical of 8 or less participants in a division.

LCQ;

Last chance qualifiers is a round where athletes who didn't qualify through to the finals from semi's, are seeded to compete against each other for a spot in the finals.

Not typical for worlds or nationals.

Finals;

The final round of competition where athletes have qualified through previous rounds, for a chance to place on the podium. Made up of 8 or less athletes.

SEEDING FOR HEATS

16 competitors:

- Heat #1: Seeds 13, 12, 5, 4
- Heat #2: Seeds 14, 11, 6, 3
- Heat #3: Seeds 15, 10, 7, 2
- Heat #3: Seeds 16, 9, 8, 1

8 competitors:

- Heat #1: Seeds 7, 6, 3, 2
- Heat #2: Seeds 8, 5, 4, 1

Other numbers of competitors are determined with the same format

2016 CANADIAN WAKE CHAMPIONSHIPS COURSE GUIDELINES

Expression:

- The course will begin as soon as you leave the dock
- Riders will complete a full lap of the cable and exit after their first run.
- Riders will have a total of two runs, 0 pick ups. Judges will take the best of the two runs for their final score.
- Riders must check in with dock starter the heat before their own, and have all equipment ready
- All safety gear must be worn, life vest and helmets
- All riders must wear a bib
- Riders will have 5 minutes if there is an equipment failure
- If the athlete has an equipment failure, raise your hand, and do not execute any more tricks in your pass

Features Only:

- There will be four or five riders on the cable at one time.
- Each heat will have 7 minutes total. The time will start once the last rider has left the dock. A horn will sound when that rider leaves.
- Riders will be judged on their best Trick ONLY on each of the allocated features
- There will be one judge on each of the allocated features that will only be judging that feature. There is no overall impression for features only. Overall score will be based on your placing on each of the designated features, based on their weight.

POINTES WAKE PARK EMERGENCY PROCEDURES

Safety Action Plan Procedure steps :
(pulled muscle, small cut, basic injury)

Basic Incident:

- 1) On site safety personal to assess and respond to the situation.
- 2) Safety personal to provide appropriate care
- 3) Safety personal to provide details to administrative staff to complete an incident report.
- 4) Administrative staff to follow up with injured person

Mid-scale injury requiring medical attention:
(injured limb, soft tissue damage, concussion)

- 1) On site safety personal to assess and respond to the situation.
 - a. Safety boat to respond to victim
 - b. Safety personal to administer appropriate care
- 2) Event Manager & administrative staff to place all “on water events” on hold until victim has been removed from water and situation has been stabilized
- 3) E vent Manager & administrative Staff to contact local hospital and arrange transportation
- 4) Safety personal to prepare victim for transportation
- 5) Event Manager & administrative staff to notify victim’s family member of incident
- 6) Safety personal to provide details to administrative staff to complete an incident report.
- 7) Administrative staff to follow up with injured person

Major injury requiring full medical attention:
(major injury , large cut, broken limb with open wound)

- 1) On site safety personal to assess and respond to the situation.
 - a. Safety boat to respond to victim
 - b. Safety personal to administer appropriate care and prepare to move victim to appointed extraction point
- 2) Event Manager & Administrative staff to contact local emergency services 911
- 3) Safety personal to prep victim for transportation for ambulance.
- 4) Event Manager & administrative staff to place all “on water events” on hold until victim has been removed from water and situation has been stabilized
- 5) E vent Manager & administrative Staff to contact local hospital

- 6) Event Manager & administrative staff to notify victim's family member of incident
- 7) Safety personal to provide details to administrative staff to complete an incident report.
- 8) Administrative staff to follow up with victim
