Familiarization Runs Straightline: Designated training for Straight-line Nationals will be from 8AM – 9:30AM on Sunday August 26th. There will be no additional cost for Sunday morning familiarization. COMPETITION RULES AND REGULATIONS:

UNDERSTANDING ROUNDS OF COMPETITION

Qualifying round;

Typical of professional events where there is a large number of participants in the same division. Cuts are made to narrow the field for the following rounds. Not implemented in Canadian Nationals.

If a category has more than 8 riders there will be a qualifying run & a final. Due to a shortened schedule for 2019 Canadian Wakeboard National Championships there will not be an LCQ round in the boat or wake park division.

SEEDING FOR HEATS

Heats will be seeded off of the 2018 Canadian Championships results.

8 competitors:

- Heat #1: Seeds 7, 6, 3, 2
- Heat #2: Seeds 8, 5, 4, 1

Other numbers of competitors are determined with the same format

2019 NAUTIQUE CANADIAN WAKE CHAMPIONSHIPS BOAT COURSE GUIDELINES

- The course will begin as soon as boat is up to speed
- Wakeboard will have 1 pick up, second fall pass is over
- Wakeskate will have 2 pick ups, third fall pass is over
- $\frac{3}{4}$ buoy will be identified, if you fall after this marker your pass is done, you will not be picked up
- There will be 1 out of course fall
- Riders must check in with dock starter the heat before there own, and have all equipment ready
- All safety gear must be worn
- All riders must wear a bib
- Riders will have 5 minutes if there is an equipment failure
- If the athlete have an equipment failure, raise your hand, and do not execute any more tricks in your pass

OPEN DIVISION QUALIFICATION CRITERIA:

Prequalification: Riders who have qualified into a semi-final round at a pro level boat event within the past three years may request to be 'pre-qualified' into the open boat divisions. Riders must show proof of results at athlete check-in.

Qualification: Open Divisions

Athletes who place in the top spots in their age divisions will qualify through into the open divisions. The total number of athletes who will qualify per divisions will be based on the talent level in those age divisions, as well as the total number of athletes in each of the age categories. Open qualifications will be posted after the event registration closes.

2019 STRAIGHTLINE NATIONALS COMPETITION RULES

- Contest format will be announced at the event under discretion of the Head Judge.
- Riders must check in with dock starter the heat before their own
- All safety gear must be worn
- All riders must wear a bib
- Riders will have 5 minutes if there is an equipment failure
- If the athlete has an equipment failure, raise your hand, and do not execute any more tricks in your pass

SPRAY LAKE / RANCH WAKE PARK EMERGENCY PROCEEDURES

Safety Action Plan Procedure steps :
(pulled muscle, small cut, basic injury)

Basic Incident:

- 1) On site safety personal to assess and respond to the situation.
- 2) Safety personal to provide appropriate care
- 3) Safety personal to provide details to administrative staff to complete an incident report.
- 4) Administrative staff to follow up with injured person

Mid-scale injury requiring medical attention:

(injured limb, soft tissue damage, concussion)

- 1) On site safety personal to assess and respond to the situation.
 - a. Safety boat to respond to victim
 - b. Safety personal to administer appropriate care
- 2) Event Manager & administrative staff to place all "on water events" on hold until victim has been removed from water and situation has been stabilized
- 3) Event Manager & administrative Staff to contact local hospital and arrange transportation
- 4) Safety personal to prepare victim for transportation

- 5) Event Manager & administrative staff to notify victim's family member of incident
- 6) Safety personal to provide details to administrative staff to complete an incident report.
- 7) Administrative staff to follow up with injured person

Major injury requiring full medical attention:

(major injury , large cut, broken limb with open wound)

- 1) On site safety personal to assess and respond to the situation.
 - a. Safety boat to respond to victim
 - b. Safety personal to administer appropriate care and prepare to move victim to appointed extraction point
- 2) Event Manager & Administrative staff to contact local emergency services 911
- 3) Safety personal to prep victim for transportation for ambulance.
- 4) Event Manager & administrative staff to place all "on water events" on hold until victim has been removed from water and situation has been stabilized
- 5) Event Manager & administrative Staff to contact local hospital
- 6) Event Manager & administrative staff to notify victim's family member of incident
- 7) Safety personal to provide details to administrative staff to complete an incident report.
- 8) Administrative staff to follow up with victim
